### 2.2.1 THE INSTITUTION ASSESSES THE LEARNING LEVELS OF STUDENTS AND ORGANIZES SPECIAL PROGRAMS FOR ADVANCED LEARNERS AND SLOW LEARNERS

Each student is unique with different abilities and capabilities, for assessment we analyse them as Advanced and Slow learners. Advanced learners are students who grasp topics faster than their peers and typically score high marks, demonstrating strong academic understanding. In contrast, slow learners face challenges in keeping up with the pace of the curriculum due to various factors, such as socio-economic background, lack of motivation, or difficulty in the medium of instruction.

At GNKCW, admission is merit-based, ensuring a mix of bright and average students. To support all students in adjusting to the learning environment, the institution implements a range of initiatives designed to cater to both advanced and slow learners.

#### **OBJECTIVES:**

- > To develop strategies that benefit both advanced and slow learners.
- > To encourage advanced learners to achieve excellence.
- > To foster an innovative and creative mindset among students.
- > To bridge the gap between slow and advanced learners.
- > To organize workshops and seminars for the benefit of both groups.

#### **MEASURES TAKEN:**

- Equal Opportunity Cell: The Equal Opportunity Cell ensures that students from diverse communal, regional, and economic backgrounds have equal access to the college's resources and infrastructure. The cell focuses on affirmative action for students from SC/ST/OBC, minority communities, and physically challenged students. For slow learners, the cell conducts remedial classes and provides academic, social, and psychological counseling to help them overcome barriers to learning.
- 2. **Parent-Teacher Meetings:** Regular parent-teacher meetings (PTMs) provide a platform for discussing students' academic performance and well-being. If a student is facing difficulties, teachers inform the parents promptly. PTMs are held at the end of each

semester, where mentors meet with parents to discuss strengths, areas for improvement, and suggestions for supporting student development. Inputs from parents are carefully considered and, where feasible, implemented by the management.

- 3. **Mentor-Mentee System:** The college has a structured mentorship system where each student is assigned a faculty mentor. Mentors track their mentees' academic progress, provide emotional and professional support, and maintain regular communication with parents. This system helps identify both slow and advanced learners early on. For slow learners, mentors offer personalized guidance, remedial support, and referrals to other subject-specific teachers for additional help. Advanced learners are encouraged to pursue academic excellence and provided with platforms for professional growth. Mentors also focus on understanding the socio-economic challenges that may affect students' performance and offer appropriate interventions.
- 4. Library Facility: The college library is accessible to all students, providing an extensive range of resources to support learning. Both slow and advanced learners can borrow books and reference materials to aid their preparation and broaden their knowledge base. The library supports students in their academic endeavors by offering additional resources for in-depth study and exam preparation.

#### **INITIATIVES FOR ADVANCED LEARNERS:**

For advanced learners, the college offers several specialized activities to enhance their academic growth and professional development:

- Recognition: Advanced learners are motivated to strive for university ranks, and semester toppers are recognized and honored.
- Academic Competitions: They are encouraged to participate in academic activities like quizzes, presentations, and group discussions.
- Career Planning: Students are guided in career planning and provided opportunities for internships, research, and skill development.
- Peer Learning: Advanced learners are encouraged to help slower peers, fostering a culture of peer learning and mutual support.
- Leadership Opportunities: They are nominated as members of college clubs, societies, and the student council, encouraging them to develop leadership skills.

- Special Coaching and Counseling: Mentors and the counseling cell offer additional coaching, support, and counseling to help slow learners improve their academic performance and build confidence.
- Practice Materials: Previous years' question papers and question banks are made available to slow learners to aid in exam preparation.
- Reinforced Practice: Repeated practice on important topics and questions helps slow learners solidify their understanding and improve their performance.

By implementing these strategies, the institution ensures that all students—whether advanced or slow learners—are provided with the necessary resources, guidance, and support to succeed in their academic journey.

The placement drive was conducted in 3 steps starting with a brief presentation about the company by the director, followed by written test and interview. The recruitment was done for the positions of technical as well as non-technical areas such as Associate Software developer, project coordinator, Business Analyst, HR executive, graphic designer and UI/ UX designer. 46 students from diverse streams participated in the drive. 30 students were selected for the interview round and finally 3 students got the offer letter for the position of MERN stack developer.
- February 02, 2024: Placement Cell organized a Career Counseling seminar on job opportunities in the government sector. Mr. Dev Raj, Branch Head, AAA Bright Academy, Ludhiana was the resource person. He apprised the students of various job opportunities in

the government sector such as UPSC, SSC CGL, SSC LDC, IBPS PO, RBI, Insurance, PSPCL, PUNSUP and allied. He talked about the benefits of government sector jobs that include handsome salary, job security, work life balance etc. He also discussed the syllabus of various competitive exams and upcoming vacancies in government sector.



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
