### Analytical Report on Student Satisfaction Survey

### (2023-2024)

The Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS) is a cornerstone of our institution's commitment to continuous improvement and the delivery of quality education. In the ever-evolving landscape of higher education, understanding the experiences, needs, and perspectives of our primary stakeholders—the students—is vital. The survey offers a structured mechanism to collect valuable insights directly from students, enabling us to tailor our strategies and initiatives to better meet their expectations and aspirations. It fulfills the requirements outlined by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) as well as reflects our dedication to enhancing students' well-being and overall academic journey.

### Scope and Objectives:

The scope of the Student Satisfaction Survey is both broad and targeted, encompassing various dimensions of student life at our institution. Its primary goals are two-fold:

- To assess how effectively the institution meets students' needs and expectations.
- To pinpoint specific areas requiring improvement.

The survey focuses on key domains such as academic programs, faculty performance, infrastructure, administrative services, extracurricular activities, and overall campus life.

The specific objectives of the survey include:

- Measuring students' overall satisfaction with their educational experience.
- Evaluating the quality of teaching and learning.
- Understanding perceptions of academic support services.
- Gathering feedback on the adequacy and quality of campus facilities and infrastructure.
- Assessing the responsiveness of administrative services.
- Identifying areas for improvement through student opinions and suggestions.

These objectives are designed to provide a comprehensive understanding of the student experience, empowering the institution to enhance educational quality, support services, and the campus environment.

### Survey Design and Methodology:

During the academic session 2023-2024, the Student Satisfaction Survey was conducted using a structured questionnaire aligned with NAAC guidelines. The survey instrument comprised:

- 20 multiple-choice questions, assessed on a 5-point Likert scale.
- One open-ended question to collect qualitative feedback and suggestions from students.

The survey was hosted as a web form on the institution's website, with the link disseminated through official WhatsApp groups to ensure wide participation. Students submitted their responses anonymously to promote honest and unbiased feedback. For the session 2023-2024, the survey received responses from 1,014 students.





### **Question-wise Analysis of the responses**




84.4% of students responded that 85-100% of the syllabus was covered in the class. However, a very low number of students (0.1%) reported that less that 30% syllabus was covered in the class.

### 2. How well did the teachers prepare for the classes?




Majority of the students (97.8%) were satisfied when questioned about the preparation of teachers related to teaching material and content.

### 3. How well were the teachers able to communicate?




89.2% of students felt that the communication with the teachers was effective.



4. The teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as


A clear majority of students (86.5%) rate the teaching methodology as Excellent (61.1%) and Very Good (25.4%).

### 5. Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers.




Majority of the students rate the evaluation process by teachers as Fair (94.4%). A very low number of respondents (0.3%) felt that the internal evaluation process is Unfair.

### 6. Was your performance in assignments discussed with you?




Most of the students (91.0%) have selected that the teachers discuss their assignments with them and point out any mistakes or additions if required.

7. The institute takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, field visit opportunities for students.





# 8. The teaching and mentoring process in your institution facilitates you in cognitive, social and emotional growth.




Large majority of students (98.0%) are satisfied with the teaching and mentoring process and agree that it facilitates their overall growth.

### 9. The institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow.




93.9% students agree on the point that the institution provides multiple opportunities for them to grow and learn.

**10.** Teachers inform you about your expected competencies, course outcomes and program outcomes.





### 11. Your mentor does a necessary follow-up with an assigned task to you.




98.3% students are satisfied that their mentors do a necessary follow-up with a task assigned to them.

### 12. The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications.




98.8% of students feel that teachers make use of examples and applications most of the time they illustrate a concept.

**13.** The teachers identify your strengths and encourage you with providing right level of challenges.




Majority (93.8%) students agree that the teachers identify their strengths and encourage them to advance further while providing the right amount of challenges and opportunities for them to grow.



### 14. Teachers are able to identify your weaknesses and help you to overcome them.



# 15. The institution makes effort to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process.




93.2% agree with the positive efforts made by the institutions towards engaging students in monitoring, reviewing and continuous improvement of the teaching learning process.

16. The institute/ teachers use student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies for enhancing learning experiences.




94.2% students feel that the institute/teachers use student centric methods for enhancing learning experiences.



17. Teachers encourage you to participate in extracurricular activities.


A very high number of students (94.2%) agree that teachers encourage them to participate in extra-curricular activities.

# 18. Efforts are made by the institute/ teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills to make you ready for the world of work.



### Suggestions/Feedback received from students

- Meditation classes should be introduced for students.

#### Infrastructure-related Suggestions and Feedback

- More ICT facilities must be provided.
- More smart classrooms must be setup.
- Air Conditioners should be provided in every classroom.
- Classrooms need to be whitewashed.
- Sports training facilities should be provided.
- Washrooms should have better facilities.
- The look of the college canteen needs to be enhanced.
- New furniture must be bought for classrooms.

- Teachers are experienced, gentle, and highly cooperative.
- A shady seating space must be provided to sit during summers.
- A full-time counselor should be appointed to handle student-related issues.
