The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) facilitated faculty participation in FDPs, Swayam-NPTEL MOOCs, and other certified training programs. Faculty members were also incentivized through financial aid for successful completion.
• Institutional access to international journals and books must be provided to support research activities.	The subscription to NLIST (National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content) was renewed, and faculty were invited to recommend books for the library.

• The parking lot for teachers needs to be renovated.	Budget was allocated for revamping the parking area, and a separate section was assigned for teachers' two-wheeler and car parking.
• A separate eating space must be provided to teachers during lunch breaks.	The staff room was renovated and expanded to include designated spaces for lunch, study, and lecture preparation.
• Healthy food options (e.g., fruits and salads) should be available in the college canteen.	The Canteen Committee expanded the menu to include healthier food options.
• More computers and ICT facilities must be provided to teachers.	The ICT infrastructure was upgraded with an allocated budget.
• Trips, excursions, and faculty exchange programs must be organized.	The Trips and Tours Committee planned educational trips for faculty, promoting experiential learning and upskilling opportunities.

• Additional fiction/non-fiction books should be added to the college library.	Regular feedback was collected from students on their book preferences, which guided library acquisitions.
• Trips and tours should be organized for students at nominal rates.	The Trips and Tours Committee arranged outings of varying durations to provide experiential learning opportunities for all students.

• Classes on physical and sports activities, including dance, should be organized.	Students were encouraged to utilize the gymnasium facilities during free periods, and additional physical activity sessions were planned.

• Career guidance sessions should begin from the first year of degree programs.	The college's mentoring system was strengthened, encouraging students to discuss career aspirations with their mentors regularly.
